Calendar Entry Change for Management of Technology MBA

Summary of change:
Updating calendar language around advance credit to reflect current program designs
Rationale for change:
The delivery of BUS 761 has changed since the previous assessment for advance credit was made and the course is now more closely tied to teamwork and cohort building. Therefore, it is recommended that all students undertaking the MOT program take this course together at the start of their studies. BUS 783 (Entrepreneurship) has been given its own course number in the Management of Technology MBA (previously was a special topic course) and now can consistently be considered for advance credit. This course covers the same learning objectives and general content as BUS 769 and BUS 797 (Business Plan I & II) in the certificate.
