Rationale for change:

**Drop 1 MATH & 1 PHYS from the lower division requirements.** Our recent departmental External Review Report noted “the first two years of an intended BISC major/honours student’s degree is dominated by subjects outside of BISC that may not be essential for students to succeed in Biology as currently practiced”. This is in-line with the recommendation of the report that we reduce non-BISC courses in the lower division.

**Addition of BISC 433 Environmental Microbiology to both the CMP and EEC concentration options.** This is a new course that includes content and skills relevant to both our CMP and EEC concentrations. The course will also be accessible to students in our Open concentration, who can select courses from the full range of upper division BISC courses.

**Addition of BISC 447 Stem Cells – Current Topics to the CMP concentration.** This is a new course and provides a strong foundation in stem cell technology, a foundational topic in regenerative medicine. Listing it as a CMP elective adds another much needed option for students in this concentration.

**Merger of the ‘conceptual courses’ into the ‘stream electives’ for the EEC concentration.** Our recent External Review noted that our programs are somewhat rigid, and students have difficulty accessing courses. We recognize that some of our ‘conceptual courses’ are not offered frequently, which constrains student choice. Merging the ‘conceptual courses’ into the ‘stream electives’ will provide students with more choice in the courses they take, and more flexibility in course scheduling. We anticipate this will benefit all EEC students, but especially those in Co-op or who have other scheduling constraints.

**Requirement that EEC concentration include at least 3 EEC stream courses at the 400 level.** This brings the EEC requirement in line with the CMP and Open concentrations (especially now that the students have more flexibility in which upper division EEC courses they take).
