Review of Undergraduate Program Block Admission and Transfer Pathways

Background

Between 2011 to 2016, Simon Fraser University established Block Admission and Transfer Credit pathway agreements with institutions in British Columbia and Alberta to Undergraduate Programs. Our active agreements require re-articulation or discontinuation to comply with the B.C. Council on Admissions and Transfer (BCCAT) Principles for Articulation.

To uphold curriculum integrity and student success, BCCAT recommends that “articulation agreements should be reviewed at least every five years by the receiving institution, even if there has not been substantive change in the sending or receiving course or program.” (BCCAT, 2023). **Appendix B** provides a list of active Block Transfer agreements.

Block Transfer occurs “when a group of courses, often in the form of a certificate, diploma, or associate degree, is recognized as a whole for transfer credit” (BCCAT, 2023). A receiving institution compares the content and structure of an entire program, rather than individual courses, as the basis to grant transfer credit. As such, articulation of Block Transfer Credit requires significant time and resourcing of faculties and departments. Students are evaluated for admission under the [College/University Transfer admission pathway](#) or “Technology (TEC)” sub-pathway for Applied Arts and Technology institutions. Applied Arts and Technology institutions are those that focus on practical and technical education in fields such as applied arts, technology and skilled trades that emphasize hands-on learning and real-world application.

Student Services Business Analysis and Assessment and Undergraduate Admissions completed data analysis on the enrollment funnel of active partnerships. Results indicate that only the Faculty of Applied Sciences has enrolled more than 30 students in the past 5 years. Detailed information on admission and retention rates can be found in **Appendix A**.

Motion

| The SCUS approve ~~the discontinuation of active Block Admission and Transfer Pathway agreements that have not been articulated within 5 years, as listed in Appendix A.~~

Students will continue to be eligible to apply for admission to the institution and would be considered for admission, but not block transferable credit. Students would be required to satisfy specific program course requirements of the College/University Transfer pathway for admission and individual course transfer credit would be awarded based on BCCAT course articulation.

## Appendix A: Enrollment Funnel Data Analysis

In partnership, Student Services Business Analysis and Assessment and Undergraduate Admissions completed data analysis on the enrollment funnel of active partnerships.

### Data Notes

- **Application terms Fall 2019 to Summer 2024 (Academic Years 2019/2020 to 2023/2024)**
- Data pulled October 1, 2024, from Student Services Data Mart
- Students are identified by their Basis of Admission code. Any student with 'TEC' in the code has applied under a TEC Block Credit.

### Data Limitations

- The current data does not provide enough granularity to identify whether all TEC Block student program credits were attempted to be transferred
- Due to how the data was recorded, some students do not have 'TEC' in their Basis of Admission code. Over the last 10 years, several students have been found with this issue. Only one specific case was identified in this dataset—a student from the Douglas Early Education program.
- The programs from which students are transferring credits are not recorded in all instances.
- One Douglas College Early Education student was not captured in the graphs due to a database error

### Data Findings

**31%** of applicants are admitted to either their primary or alternative academic program. In comparison, SFU's Non-FIC Post-Secondary Transfer admit percentage from the same time-period is **49%**.

Although we have a small number of TEC Block Credit students, their retention rate is comparable to that of other Non-FIC Post-Secondary Transfers.


Our four partner institutions are British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT), Douglas College, Native Education College, and Vancouver Community College. As shown in the table below, most students apply from BCIT, with only a few students coming from Douglas College. When extending the timeframe to the past 10 years, only one student has applied from Vancouver Community College, and no applications have been received from Native Education College.


A total of 331 applications have been received over the timeframe. The number of applications exceeds the number of unique students, as some students applied more than once. Overall, the volume of applications has remained steady, with no significant changes over the past five years.

**Figure 1: Applications by Academic Year**



Computer Science is the largest applied academic program by a significant margin, representing **31%** of all applications. The Bachelor of Arts is the second most popular, accounting for **13%** of applications.

**Figure 2: Applications by Primary Academic Applied Program**



In addition to the low admission rates, a breakdown of each applied program shows that many students are not admitted to their primary choice and are instead accepted into their secondary program.
