Ming & Stella Wong Endowment Fund Terms of Reference

Summary

The Ming & Stella Wong Endowment Fund supporting the Ming & Stella Wong Chair in International Business was first established in 1984. It was originally named the Asia Pacific Studies Chair, and was renamed the Ming & Stella Wong Chair in International Business in 1990. The fund was established with grants and donations from the Government of Canada, the Government of British Columbia, Ming and Stella Wong, and BC Bearing Engineers. The endowment has reached an annual spending allocation that will support more than one faculty position and, in 2025, Stella Sun (previously Wong) agreed to establish a Professorship to be supported by this endowment, in addition to the Chair. These terms replace all previous iterations.

The purpose of the Ming & Stella Wong Chair in International Business and the Stella Sun Professorship in International Management is to carry out research and teaching activities in the fields of international business and international management, with a preference for a focus on Asia Pacific region countries, and to provide expertise to the public and private sectors in these areas. Income from the Fund will be used to provide salary supplements and support the teaching and research activities of the Chair and the Professorship.

The administrator of the Fund is the Vice-President, Academic, or their designate.

Chair Appointment

The Ming & Stella Wong Chair in International Business will hold a tenure-track faculty position in the University. The successful candidate will have a proven record in international business; be well regarded in their field; and should have already gained a significant reputation in academic circles.

The appointment will be for a five (5) year renewable term.

The holder of the Ming & Stella Wong Chair in International Business shall be selected based on the recommendation of the SFU Beedie School of Business' Tenure and Promotion Committee, and subject to the approval of the Dean, SFU Beedie School of Business, and the Vice-President, Academic and Provost.

Professorship Appointment

The Stella Sun Professorship in International Management will hold a tenure-track faculty position in the University. The successful candidate will have a proven record in international management; be well regarded in their field; and should have already gained a significant reputation in academic circles.

The appointment will be for a five (5) year renewable term.

The holder of the Stella Sun Professorship in International Management shall be selected based on the recommendation of the SFU Beedie School of Business' Tenure and Promotion Committee, and subject

to the approval of the Dean, SFU Beedie School of Business, and the Provost & Vice-President, Academic.

Fund Administration

Simon Fraser University

The Fund will be invested and the annual spending allocation of the Fund, defined in the University's Endowment Management Policy GP20, will be used each year to support the Purpose. Any unspent spending allocation may be carried forward to another term or academic year, or reinvested in the Fund to protect its value over time. The capital of the Fund will be held in perpetuity.

The Purpose may be amended or supplemented by a document in writing signed and delivered by the parties hereto. For clarity, a personal representative of the Donor will be considered to be a party hereto in the event the Donor is unable for any reason to undertake the amendment of this Purpose.

In the event that the Purpose for which the Fund is established is fulfilled or frustrated and the University, despite its reasonable commercial efforts, is unable to contact the Donor, or his/her representatives, to amend the Purpose, the University may alter the Purpose provided that any such alteration will be in keeping with the original spirit and general intention of the Purpose.

Terms of Reference Revised May 2011

The Ming & Stella Wong Endowment Fund supporting the Ming & Stella Wong Chair in International Business was first established in 1984. It was originally named the Asia Pacific Studies Chair, and was renamed the Ming and Stella Wong Chair in International Business in 1990. The fund was established with grants and donations from the Government of Canada, the Government of British Columbia, Ming and Stella Wong, and BC Bearing Engineers.

Purpose of the Endowment

The purpose of the Ming & Stella Wong Chair is to carry out research and teaching activities in the fields of business and trade between Canada and the Asian Pacific countries and to provide expertise to the public and private sectors in these areas. Income from the Fund will be used to provide salary supplements and research expenses for the Chair.

Fund Administration

The Endowment Fund will be held by Simon Fraser University. The administrator of the Fund will be the Vice-President, Academic. Donations to the Endowment Fund may be received through Simon Fraser University.

The capital of the Endowment Fund will be held in perpetuity. A portion of annual earned income may be reinvested in the Endowment Fund to protect its value over time when overall endowment earnings exceed the University's disbursement quota, as stipulated in Endowment Management Policy GP 20 (the "Policy"). Also as established by the Policy, a portion of annual earned income will be used each year to support the activities of the Ming & Stella Wong Chair, including teaching and research.

In the event that circumstances make the specified use of the Endowment Fund no longer practicable or desirable, the Board of Governors of Simon Fraser University is hereby authorized to make any changes it may deem necessary in the terms or use of the Éndowment Fund, such changes, however, to be in keeping as far as possible with the original spirit and general interest of the Endowment Fund.
