Project Group Courses: CMNS 408-4, CMNS 428-4, CMNS 448-4, CMNS 458-4

For these courses, students need to figure out a topic related to the appropriate area of CMNS, and find a professor to supervise and grade their work (usually one medium-length research paper). Some professors allow “groups” of one student; others require 3-4 (or more) students to work together. There is a project group form to be completed (by EVERY student in a project group, and signed by the student and the instructor, before you submit it to a CMNS Undergraduate Advisor along with a copy of your advising transcript for registration. This form is on the CMNS website (<http://www.sfu.ca/communication/undergraduate/checklists-and-forms.html>).

Directed Study Courses: CMNS 479-1, CMNS 480-2, CMNS 481-3, CMNS 482-4, CMNS 483-5

Each of the above courses requires a CMNS form and SFU advising transcript submitted to a CMNS Undergraduate Advisor for registration. These courses must be supervised by a faculty member in CMNS. Field Placement Courses: (CMNS 461-3) and Field Placement in CMNS (CMNS 489-4)

Each of the above courses requires a CMNS form and advising transcript submitted to a CMNS Undergraduate Advisor prior to registration. These courses must be supervised by a faculty member in CMNS.
