

## Technovation GirlsBC 2021 Workshop Series

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### About Technovation Girls

Technovation Girls is the world's largest global tech entrepreneurship competition for girls\* aged 10-18 and Technovation GirlsBC is the chapter ambassador of the province of BC. All events and workshops under the Technovation GirlsBC program are offered collaboratively by UBC Geering Up, SFU Applied Sciences Outreach, and BCIT Computing.

In this global competition, participants will either work in a team (up to 2-5 participants) or individually to identify a problem in their community, learn how to code, and build a mobile app. All participants will also record and submit their business pitch at the end of the competition. Participants from the senior division (15-18 years old) will submit a business plan in addition to a business pitch. There will be multiple levels of judging and prizes to be won!

*\*Please note: our use of the word girl/female is inclusive of all those who identify as female in a way that's meaningful to them.*

## Overview of workshop series

The following virtual workshops (see table under Schedule) will be offered to our students as a series, meaning that when you sign up, you are expected to attend all the workshops. **Please note that all workshops will be delivered virtually via Zoom.**

### Learning objectives

Through participating in this workshop series, you will gain a comprehensive experience in

- 1) Formulating an idea for your app,
- 2) Collecting and analyzing data to support the purpose of your app,
- 3) Planning your app design, and, last but not least,
- 4) Building a functional app using Thinkable.

Upon completion of our workshop series, students will have gone through the ideation and app development stages and have a functional app that they can use as a reference to build their own projects for Technovation Girls 2021 competition.
