• Enrollment - highlights:

New students - 2010 - 100 fewer new students than last year.

Applications and offers are up. The Dean discussed changes in application numbers across the faculties.

- <u>Scholarships Days</u>-Associate Dean George Agnes to host several meetings on campus.
- <u>Tri Council Success Rates:</u> 71% success. SSHRC Masters 100%; NSERC 78%

<u>Annual Reports:</u>

The focus has been on changing ineffective behaviours. Supervisory committees now assigned -98% responded to the call for information. 50 % of those without committees now have committees in place.

Where 'Unsatisfactory Status' assigned during annual reports – departments are being asked to file a follow up report

Where departments require students to withdraw after first semesters – a new fairer system of assessment is being discussed.

- <u>40th Anniversary of Graduate Studies</u> DGS is planning a celebration 3 graduate student days with conference presentations.
- <u>Faculty of Graduate Studies</u> research is ongoing as per recommendation of the last External Review.
- <u>Graduate Studies Centre</u> work continues towards a centre that will serve both social and academic purposes.
- SAR Steering Committee will have a "meet and greet" with SAR students and SAR senior supervisors on October 18th. Invitations will go out shortly. HSCI students have already attended orientations.
