4. Chair's Report

The Chair announced the decision to move forward with creation of the coordinator position to direct, mediate and solve graduate students' concerns and have the description in place for the next budget meeting. They will work closely with GPS and other stakeholders to support students facing difficulties in their programs.

The university is working to support Afghani scholars. This initiative is in collaboration with Scholars at Risk (SAR), a global association designed to support scholars facing threats due to their research, identity or other social-political formation putting them at risk, and other offices at SFU. GPS has put together a package to support these students by offering them positions within the graduate programs or research assistant positions. The committee is encouraged to put forward the names of applicants in their program coming out of

Afghanistan, as we have support in place for them. SFU presently has two students coming in through this program.

6. For Discussion

SGSC discussed concerns around the commencement of in-person learning this fall. Committee members raised questions around the likelihood of students refusing to wear masks in classrooms and procedures to follow in this regard. A committee member suggested that instructors be promptly notified of students with masks exemptions. It was recommended that caution must be executed if campus security has to be involved with those not wearing masks.

A committee member brought up the case of a graduate student refusing to travel to Canada to commence in-person learning. SFU international also has a level of involvement in this case as migrating to Canada is one of the conditions of obtaining a post-graduate work permit. Questions were raised about funding from SFU being sent abroad. Many committee members expressed that students are making both informal and formal requests to learn remotely.
