SFU First Nations Languages Program (FNLP) has partnered with First Nations speech communities and organizations to offer courses in some 18 Indigenous languages in British Columbia and Yukon off-campus in First Nations communities.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

CERTIFICATE IN FIRST NATIONS LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY (CFNLP)

This program is for students who wish to acquire conversational and literacy skills in a particular First Nations language, to teach this language in schools, or to enhance their language for cultural reasons or professional objectives. The certificate can be completed on a full or part time basis. www.sfu.ca/fnlp/programs/certificate

DIPLOMA IN FIRST NATIONS LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY (DFNLP)

This program is for students who wish to acquire high intermediate to advanced oral proficiency in a particular First Nations language, to revitalize their languages or to teach this language as a post-secondary educator. Prerequisite is completion of the Certificate in First Nations Language Proficiency (CFNLP). Visit: www.sfu.ca/fnlp/programs/diploma

ENROLLMENT DATE

SFU sends an automatic email each term with your enrollment date which is the earliest date you can enroll into courses for an upcoming academic term. A student who has not enrolled in courses in three consecutive terms will have to apply for Reactivation or Readmission - see www.sfu.ca/fnlp/admission for more information.

COURSE ENROLLMENT

Cohort course enrollment is processed by FNLP. Students wishing to take non-FNLP program courses at SFU may self enroll into those courses using goSFU during your enrollment period.

Prior to enrolling into courses, please make sure your student account is up-to-date and that your pre-approved tuition sponsorship authorization form is submitted by your band sponsor as soon as possible to the FNLP office in order to ensure enrollment eligibility.

The deadline to pay fees is Week 2 Day 5 of the academic term or at the time of course enrollment if enrollment occurs after this date. The application fee, payable to 'Simon Fraser University' is due upon receipt of your application. Fees are subject to change.

GRADUATION APPLICATION
