real life picture

.33 population illiterate

church authoritarian influence

laws prohibiting youth workers ignored

no workers' rights

industrialization -> immorality and social disorder



reasons & actions

government wants to maintain social class structure

ideal: education as economic progress without changing social order

in practice: propaganda of patriotism for the peasants
(in form of fables *Pinocchio*, *Cuore*, etc.)

education for middle class but lacking industrial base

- > abundance of doctors and lawyers
- > become critics of Liberalism (i.e. socialists, fascists, Nationalists, etc.)



reaction

for peasants, bleaker
outlook than ever



between 1881-1900, 1.5 million
peasants moved to americas



Left and Right tried burying old differences

artisans.

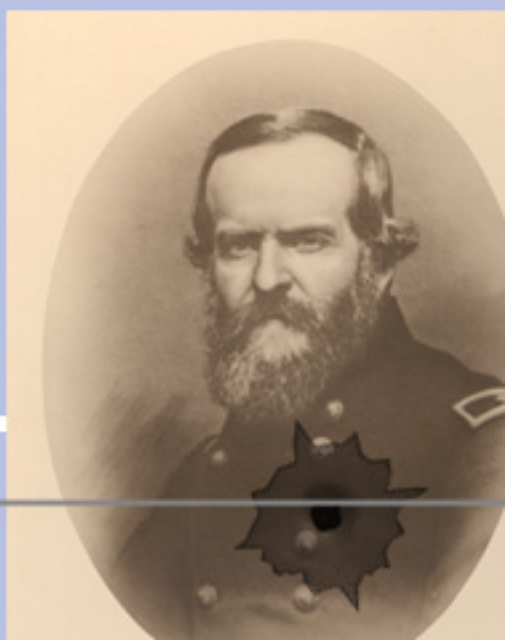
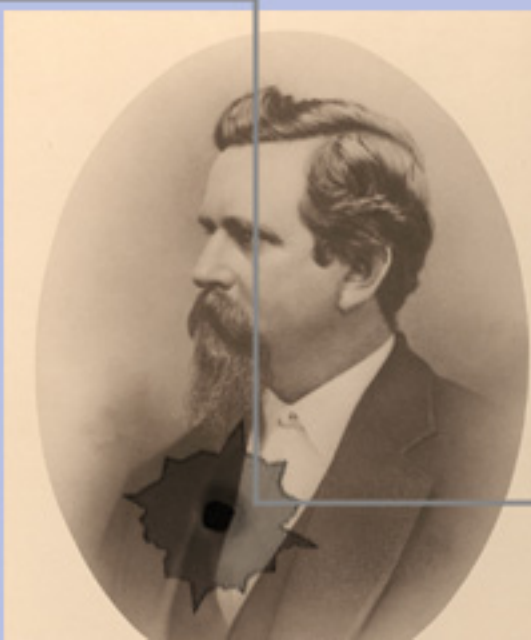

Francesco Crispi became Prime Minister



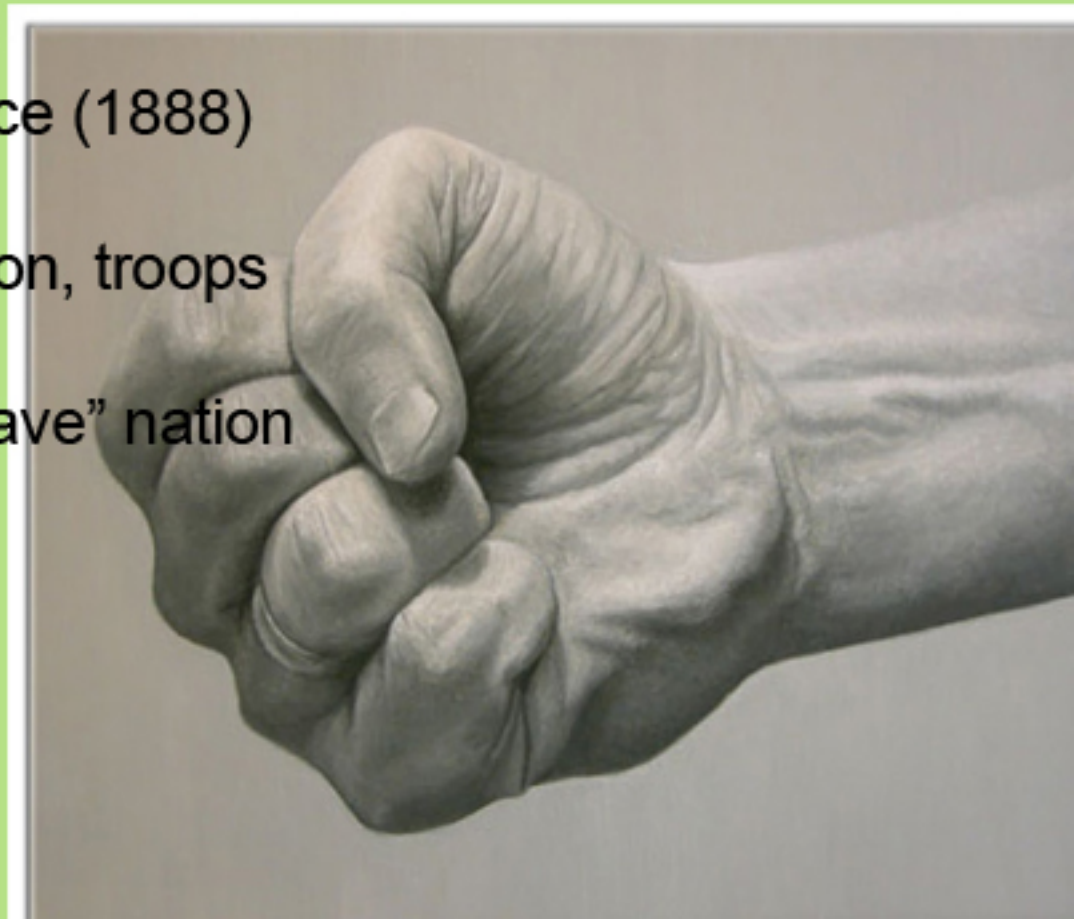
directed attention to starting war with France (1888)
