COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will further explore the foundations of phonological theory; in particular it will consider the nature of phonetic and phonological representations and phonological processes. The course has as its objectives an understanding of the current state of phonological research, and the developing of skills for explaining phonological phenomena in a wide variety of languages through applying current phonological theories.
