4. REPRESENTING TONE

- a. Consider the realization of tone in Vata phonology. Why cannot the appearance of the low tone in the perfective forms be satisfactorily explained by employing the SPE approach? I what way does autosegmental phonology appear to be superior in accounting for the realization of tone in Vata phonology?
- b. Consider the realization of tone in Igbo phonology. Why cannot the appearance of falling tone before a low tone be satisfactorily explained by employing the SPE approach? What is the solution offered by autosegmental phonology?
- c. In what way does the autosegmental theory appear to be superior to the linear approach to phonology?
